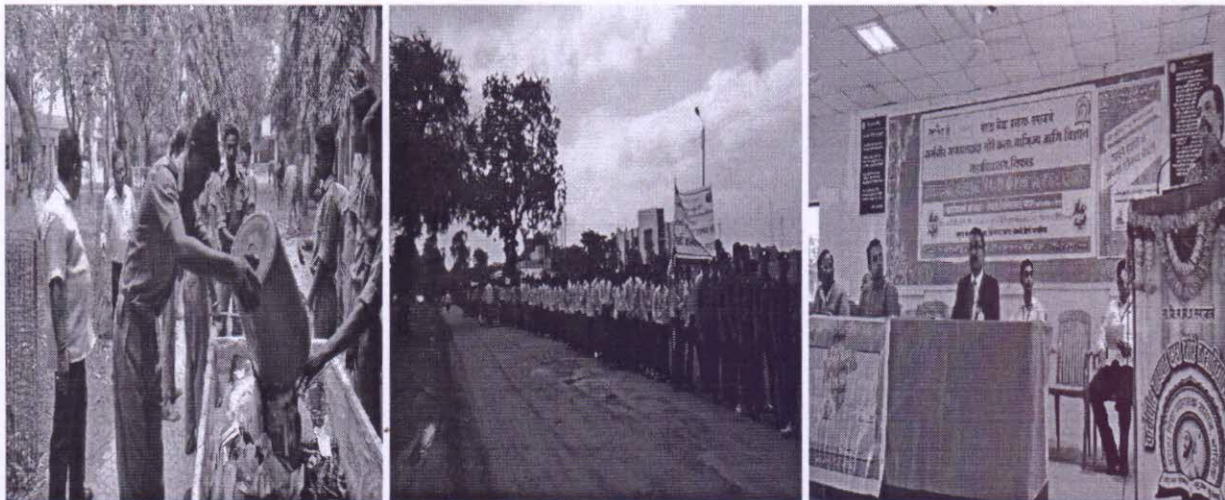

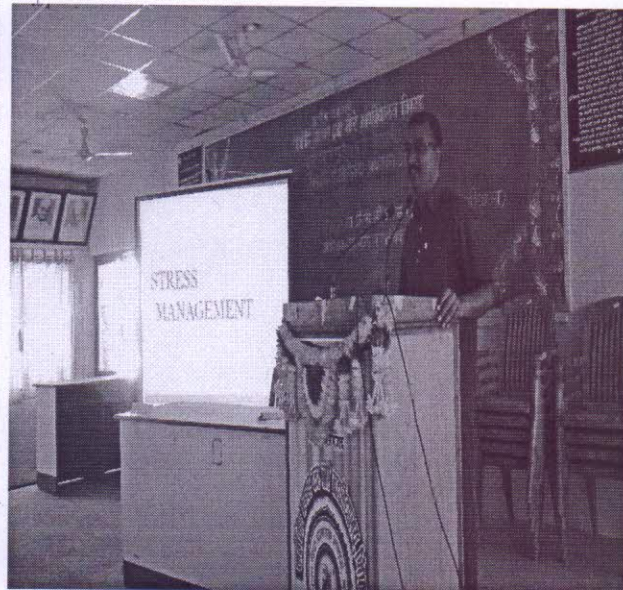

Trees not only remove harmful chemicals from soil but they are also good since they are renewable ,biodegradable and recyclable .

**The context –** According to Madhav Vrunda Project the College established Greeneries wherever possible planting trees so as to increase O<sub>2</sub> level in environment which is the most essential gas on globe.

It creates-

-Habitat for other species

-Provides carbon sinks to extract major green house gas from atmosphere

-Stabilize soil to prevent erosion creating natural water filters.

The Practice- During Year 2015-16 the college Staff and Students Were plant 300 trees around College area. These Planted trees are adapted by Students and Staff for protection and development. On the occasion of Raksha-bandhan in our College 30 staff and 60 students would tie Rakhi to their adopted plants to make an emotional attachment and betterment of growth of plants .

Our College had also organized *Vruksha dindi*, a procession of tree saplings in which students will actively participated , by using this Vruksha dindi students pass the messages “save trees save world.

## **Practice II) Eco-friendly initiatives-**

### **Title of Practice- Eco-friendly initiatives in college**

#### **Goal-**

#### **The Context-**

In eco-friendly initiatives the college students prepared and distributed handmade cloth bags in village, which is adopted by college under N.S.S. program. The concept of bag distribution is to reduce, reuse and recycle. Students have tried to make Polythene free environment.

Online environment projects are made by students to save paper and the college also reduced usage of paper.

Massive tree plantation is an eco-friendly activity of our college, to provide carbon sinks to extract major green house gas from atmosphere. In this year college had organized seminar on the topic "Effect Of Chemical pollutants on Biodiversity" .

#### **The Practice-**

1. The College installed solar panel in ladies hostel
2. Environment projects by students submitted online only soft copy and no hard copy.
3. Bird feeder for thirsty and hungry birds.
4. Use of saline bags to save plants due to heavy sunlight and dry atmosphere.
5. Development of composter.

#### **Evidence of success-**

- 1) Solar water heater in working condition and saving power consumption of college.
- 2) Bird feeder in good condition and number of birds regularly visit the garden
- 3) 55 plants are tied with used saline bags working in good condition and because of it there is consistent growth in the plants.
- 4) Total 373 soft copies of environmental awareness projects submitted by second year B.A., B. Com. and B.Sc students that has reduced 373 usage of notebooks and also saved so much trees from cutting.

#### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:**

1. It was difficult to maintain repairing cost of solar panel.
2. The environmental awareness projects submitted by students through online system was difficult task for students who are not good with computer skills, so some selected group leaders were given the task to monitor this activity.
3. Student committees were prepared to installed used saline bags to each plant and it was duty of volunteer students to fill bags with adequate water regularly so need to give more time for this work in addition to academic activities.

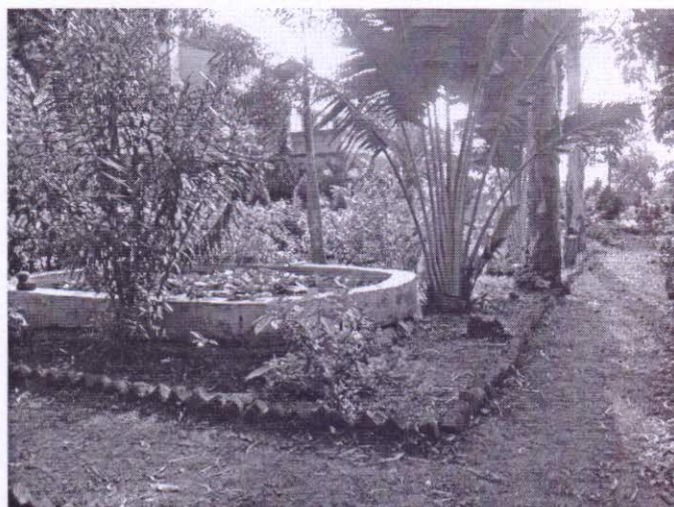
#### 7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection




