

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ABOUT MARATHA VIDYA PRASARAK SAMAJ, NASHIK

The Revolutionary thought of Mahatma Jyotirao Phule- "There is no other alternative but education for social change." created an awareness about education in the common masses of Maharashtra. The same thought was pursued by the great thinker-reformers like His Highness Rajarshee Shahu Maharaj, His Highness Shreemant Sayajirao Gaikwad Maharaj, Maharshee Vitthal Ramji Shinde, Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar, Dr.Karmveer Bhaurao Patil, Dr.Punjabrao Deshmukh and others. These visionaries firmly believed that unless we open the channels of education from pre-primary to higher level, the light of knowledge will not reach to the doors of masses in the villages. The followers of this tradition, Karmveer Raosaheb Thorat, Karmaveer Ganpat dada More, D. R. Bhosale and others initiated the task of spreading education by establishing 'Udoji Maratha Hostel' in Nashik in1914. It was a significant beginning of Maratha Vidya Prasarak Samaj. It was in 1913 that All India Maratha Education Conference was organized in Nashik where His Highness Shreemant Udojirao Pawar of Dhar Residency donated Rs.10,000/-which strengthened the very foundation of the Institution. In order to stabilize the work of the Institution, His Highness starteda grant of Rs. 2,000/- per annum. Rajarshee Shahu Maharaj donated Rs.15000/-

-,Shreemant Sayajirao Gaikwad Maharaj donated Rs.12,000/-,His Highness Shreemant Madhavrao Maharaj of Gwalior Residency donated Rs.10,000/-.The then Industrialist Pandurang Javaji Chaudhari of Mumbai donated Rs.3,000/- and others blessed the Institution in the form of donation so as to enable it to expand its educational work.

'Bahujan Hitaya Bahujan Sukhaya': Education for the Welfare and Happiness of the Common Masses' is the motto of the Institution. To follow this motto and to help the masses, the then social workers like Shankarrao Kadam, Kirtiwanrao Nimbalkar, Vitthalrao Gadhave, Kanaladkar, Bhausaheb Hiray, Kakasaheb Wagh, Annasaheb Murkute came forward. The Institution (MVPSamaj) gained name and fame in a short time due to well organization and disciplined planning. Since various donors and social workers belonging to various places generously helped the Institution, the small plant of the Institution began to blossom. The year 1964 was celebrated as its Golden Jubilee year. The year 2014 was celebrated as its Century. The qualitative and quantitative sky rocketing development of the Institution is simply wonderful. The contribution and devotion of the ex-office bearers and in office bearers as well as the members of the Executive Council have made this miraculous development possible. The Government of Maharashtra felicitated the Institution by giving a State Award to honor its educational and social work in 2000. Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nashik praised the Institution by giving it the 'Punjabrao Deshmukh Award' in 2006.

Online Admission will be given to all degree courses

Eligibility conditions and rules regarding the admission to the first year of three-year B.A./B.Com/B.Sc./Degree Course:

- **A)** Admission: Admission to the first year of all courses will be given as per merit at H.S.C. examination, norms and rules of Pune University and Govt. of Maharashtra & Management of the College.
- 1. The student must have passed H.S.C. examination or any equivalent exam. of authentic and Government recognized body.
- 2. A student should apply in the prescribed form with necessary certificate of eligibility and fees for admission.
- 3. Students from other colleges affiliated to the University of Pune will seek admission directly. However, they will have to obtain Transfer Certificate from the previous attended college.
- 4. A student migrating from other University of Maharashtra and out of Maharashtra should apply in the prescribed form for the 'Eligibility Certificate 'with necessary fees.
- 5. All the fresh admissions will be provisional and will be confirmed after the receipt of Eligibility Certificate from the University of Pune.
- 6. The First Year students will have to undergo for compulsory medical checkup.

- 2) Leaving Certificate (L.C.) & Transfer Certificate (T.C.)
- 3) Migration Certificate (in case of student from other Universities)

- **C)** Important Instructions:
- 1) The student seeking admission in this college is liable to pay fees for the whole term.
- 2) The student seeking concession EBC/WPT/STW in fees and/or applying for scholarship should submit the forms along with relevant documents.
- 3) At the time of seeking admission at S.Y. level, the student should have passed F.Y. examination or A.T.K.T.at F.Y. level.
- 4) To get admission in T.Y.B.A. /B.Com /B.Sc.the student must have passed in all the subjects of F.Y.B.A /B.Com/B.Sc.

Facilities in the college

Library

The college Library came into existence in 1971, with the establishment of Karmaveer Ganpat Dada More Arts, Commerce and Science College. Initially the library was located in the small room in the main building with no space for various sections. It was later on shifted to a separate building with spacious reading rooms, Stack room, Periodical Section, Internet Room etc. in the year 2007-2008. The new building is located in front of college building and easily accessible by various departments. The new building of library is spread over area of 314sq mtr. (Built up area). Library has good collection on diverse areas of knowledge such as Languages and Literature, Social Sciences, Humanities, Commerce and Management, Pure and Applied Science, sports and Fine arts etc. Library is administered by the Librarian, with the assistance of a Library Clerks and 3 Library Attendants with the help of Library Advisory Committee. Reading rooms: Separate reading rooms are there for girls and boys.

Total books 35838 Magazines 29 and Journals 31 are available in the library.

N.S.S.: The College has an active N.S.S. unit, which is engaged in organizing, special winter camp, workshops, extension programmes etc.

N.C.C.: The seventh Maharashtra Battalion has a N.C.C. unit of 50students. The college gives them guidance and training to pass A,B,C certificate exams.

Special Note for Sr. College Students: Students offering N.C.C. and N.S.S. and who are awarded in State Level debating, drama and sports competitions are eligible to claim 10 marks at the end of their final year under ordinance 163 of the University of Pune. It is applicable to all faculties.

OTHER SPECIAL FEATURES

IQAC: The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is established as per the guidelines of NAAC with an aim for maintaining the movement of quality consciousness in the college. The IQAC Organizes regular meeting for quality Sustenance and enhancement.

Students' Grievance Redress Committee: The committee looks in to the grievances and problems of students. The students can approach the committee for their academic, administrative and personal problems in the college either personally or through the complaint boxes.

The Anti-Ragging Committee: The Anti Ragging Committee has been established in the college. The Committee looks forward to sort-out the problems of those students who are victimized by ragging.

Student Council: The student's council will be formed as per the Rule and regulations of S. P. P. University, Pune and The Govt. of Maharashtra.

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Earn and Learn Scheme: The scheme has been actively implemented for the poor and needy students, who would like to work for a few hours on the college campus to get some financial help.



Alumni Association: For the past students of the college this association offers a unique platform to interact with the students admitted in the college from all the faculties. The alumni contribute to the development of students at large by sharing their academic and professional experiences.

Annual Social Gathering: The college arranges Annual Social Gathering of the students giving a platform to the students to explore their sub talents.

Placement Support Cell: There is placement support cell for the third year (Final Year) students which arrange campus interviews of reputed firms and industries. The cell plays a key role in facilitating students for good job opportunities.

College Magazine: The college publishes the Magazine entitled 'Makarand' to create imaginative expressions in students.

Competitive Exam Cell: The cell guides students to appear for competitive exams such as UPSC, MPSC, etc. by arranging Lectures of the experts from various fields and provide guidance and training.

Vidyarthini Manch: A Forum is specially established for the girl students. Activities such as personal guidance and counseling, lectures of the experts with respect to social and women related issues, Physical and Mental health problem etc. are organized by the Forum.

Field Visit and Study Tours: Field visit and study tours are arranged for the students for the enrichment of their knowledge and experience.

Cultural Program: The college organizes various cultural programs and competitions and encourages students to participate in them. Our students have been participating in various intercollegiate competitions and youth festivals.

Remedial Coaching Classes: These classes are specially conducted for the students who are weak in the respective subjects.



Seminars and Workshops: Fearless Girl campaign, Extra Mural lecture-series, Lectures for the senior citizens, seminars for the teachers are organized. Blood Group Detection is done for all the students.

The college has a Botanical garden, a Vermi-culture unit, rain water harvesting unit, solar energy unit, a health- centre, and a canteen.

General Library Rules:

To encourage meritorious student number of prizes are given every year. In addition to this free scholarship for deserving students, to the backward and scheduled caste students, Govt. scholarship, insurance benefits & student aid fund free ships are also provided.



SCHOLARSHIPS AND CONCESSIONS

- 1. Various Scholarships offered and Eligibilities for them
- National Merit Scholarship:
 Minimum 50% marks in Annual Examination available up to graduation.
- 3. Open Merit State Government scholarship: As per Merit.
- 4. Primary and Secondary Teacher's wards Merit Scholarship: As per merit.
- 5. Scholarship for Physically Handicapped: Certificate of Handicap issued by the civil surgeon.
- 6. Scholarship on Merit and Income: Merit + Income of parents
- 7. Central Government Scholarship for SC/ST/NT students: Students belonging to Government notified: SC/ST/NT categories like Mahar, Mang, Chambhar, Bhil, Mahadev- Koli, Gond, Phase Pardhi etc.
- 8. Rajashri Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaja Scholarship SC, NT and SBC students securing 75% marks or more are eligible for this scholarship.
- 9. **Other Backward Class (OBC) scholarship:** OBC students having OBC caste certificate from competent authority and income of parents less than Rs.1,00,000/- are eligible for this scholarship.
- 12. **Other Backward Class (OBC) Freeship:** All OBC students having OBC caste certificate from competent authority are eligible for this freeship.
- Minority Scholarship Scheme (Post-Metric Scholarship) as per Government of Maharashtra GR(542/07)the Scholarship is applicable for minority communities such as Muslim, Parsi, Sikh, Christian, Buddhist and Jain students. The students who are economically backward from these communities are entitled to get free education from IIth Std. to PhD .provided they have obtained 50% of marks in the examination attended previously.
- 14. **Savitribai Phule Financial Assistance Scheme:** The financially poor girl students of the college can avail Savitribai Phule Financial Assistance Scheme run by the S.P. Pune University.
 - If a student getting scholarship fails in the examination, she/he is not eligible for the scholarship twice(while studying in the same class). Students eligible for the scholarships should collect application forms from the college office at the time of admission. The duly completed scholarship forms, accompanied with necessary authentic documents must be submitted online and in the office before given due date and the receipt of the same obtained from the



college office should be maintained. No complaints, inquiries regarding the scholarship and fee concession will be entertained after 31st March . For any difficulty contact the appropriate college authority.

Fee Concessions:

- 1) Concession in fees for the freedom fighters' wards: Applications are to be sent to the Zillah Parishad office.
- E.B.C. concession: This concession is given to students whose parents' income is less than Rs.One lakh in previous year. The prescribed forms are available in the college office.
 Students desirous to apply for this concession should collect forms from the college office and should submit it before 15th July. Following documents must be attached along with the EBC concession form:
- A) Income certificate for the students from:
- i) Rural areas: Income certificate should have been attested by the member of Zillah Parishad or Panchayat Samiti.
- ii) Urban areas (population more than 10, 000) 'The income certificate must be Attested by either Executive Magistrate or Tahasildar or Cooperator of the Municipal Corporation.
- B) Affidavit of the parent (for rural areas)
- 3. Concession in fees for Secondary Teachers Wards/Primary Teachers Wards:
 This fee concession is given to the students whose parents are secondary teachers/Primary teachers (with SSC, D. Ed or STC). Application in prescribed Performa should be submitted to the college before15th July.
- 4. Concession in tuition fees as per the directions given by the MVP Samaj for its employees' children.
- 5. Students who fulfill necessary criteria,(both educational and economic)are given concessions in fees. It is the responsibility of the students to fill-in the necessary forms within due dates, to secure acknowledgement and to preserve it for the academic year.

GENERAL RULES OF DISCIPLINE

Students will follow all the norms of discipline of the college. Rules regarding routine work, behavior on the campus, classrooms and library, at various functions and during examinations should be properly observed by all the students. The regulations jointly made by the University of Pune, Educational Council, State Government and College Management should be strictly followed by all students.

- 1) Uniform code is compulsory for all the students.
- 2) Students must carry their Identity Cards with them in the college campus.
- 3) Vehicles must be parked at the parking places only. Helmet Compulsory.
- 4) Students must not bunk lectures/practical.
- 5) Smoking, drinking, liquor, chewing gutkha, Panmasala and spitting is strictly prohibited on the college campus.
- 6) Photography in the campus is not allowed.
- 7) Weapons that may cause physical injury are prohibited in the campus.
- 8) Writing anything on the walls of classroom or toilet, throwing pieces of paper, materials and scraps anywhere on the campus is prohibited.
- 9) The furniture, lamps, fans etc. in the classroom should be used carefully damage should in anyway be caused to the college property.
- 10) Shouting, causing nuisance, banging on staircase, speaking in the reading hall, loitering in the college porch are prohibited.
- 11) Visitors are not allowed in the campus unless special permission is granted.
- 12) Students will have to follow all the rules made by the laboratories and the library.
- 13) Students are not allowed to enter on the terrace or in the garden without permission.
- 14) Study tours could be arranged only by the permission of the Principal. The college will not be responsible for the tours conducted without permission.
- 15) In case of any complaint, contact the Principal. Do not directly-approach the newspapers or any other media.
- 16) No student will participate in any anti-social or anti-college campaign. Nor will they take part in any religious movement.



- 17) Students will participate in all constructive activities and co-operate in all extracurricular, curricular and cultural activities organized by the college.
- 18) Use of unfair means in the examination is a punishable offence.
- 19) Original Certificates once submitted will not be returned.
- 20) Strict action will be taken if any alterations in documents are made.
- 21) No groups, organizations, forums of students are formed in the campus without prior permission of the Authorities.
- 22) The examination forms will be detained if students would have less than 75% attendance.
- 23) Students will have to observe all other regulations made from time to time by college authorities.
- 24) Students' progress will be informed to the parents periodically.
- 25) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. Ragging is an offence.
- 26) The students must keep their mobiles on silent mode when they are in the campus.

The Following measures may be taken in case of non-observance of rules and regulations

- 1) Cancellation of admission.
- 2) Cancellation of examination forms.
- 3) Stopping Scholarship.
- 4) Rustication from examination/college.
- 5) Withholding examination results.
- 6) Suspension from college.
- 7) Penalization for in disciplinary act on the college campus.
- 8) Confiscation of deposit.
- 9) Lodging a complaint in the Police Station..
- 10) Reporting to the Appropriate Authority.



Circular No. 170 of 2009 Savitribai Phule Pune University

It is hereby notified for information of all concerned that in view of the Judgment and Order dated11.2.2009 of the Hon. Supreme Court of India in the matter of the University of Kerala V/s Council of Principals of Colleges in Kerala and Others, the following measures shall be taken to prevent ragging in the colleges/Institutions:

- 1. In the prospectus of the Higher Educational Institutions, it should be mentioned that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority concerned, the accused student will be given an opportunity to explain and if his explanation is not satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the institution. The number of cases of ragging and punishment given by the educational institutions in the previous academic year should also be in corporate in the prospectus of Higher Educational Institutions.
- 2. Anti-ragging committees and squads to check ragging should be constituted and the names and telephone numbers of officials to be contacted by the students in case of ragging should also be published.
- 3. Counseling sessions and orientation courses for senior and fresh students should be conducted.
- 4. All institutions should do whatever they can by ensuring punishment to the students found guilty of ragging, giving wide publicity to such punishments to act as a deterrent, strict enforcement of the various measures for preventing ragging.
- 5. Appropriate messages regarding "zero tolerance" towards ragging should be incorporated in admission notices/advertisements.
